Moore Arts and Dale Neill invite all keen photographers to join in what promises to be a fun-filled weekend of photography at the idyllic, laid back Moore River Estuary. We will explore the river, stunning well-known and secret spots, choosing picturesque locations.



Topics to be covered: landscapes, macro, mobile phone photography, wildflowers, sunset shoot, tips for travel photographers.

We start with a pre-flight check list on your camera. This ensures your camera is tuned and primed to capture quality images.

A sunset shoot is organized for Saturday evening before you join your fellow photographers for an optional evening meal at the Country Club. Dale will pass on tips for travellers and the workshop will conclude with a review of your weekend photographs.

Guilderton

Guilderton is an ideal weekend retreat located on the Moore River Estuary, 90kms north of and less than two hours drive from Perth. There are several beautiful places to photograph: the isolated area near **the Lighthouse**, giving 360 degree views over bushland; undulating sand dunes and **the river mouth** where the river meets the Indian Ocean. As we move **upriver**, you can photograph Silver Creek, the boardwalk and the sand hills of the desert where the energetic enjoy a thrilling slide down to the water's edge. In winter you may catch glimpses of canoeists, fishers and water birds.

The Country Club

The Country Club will be our base for the two days, starting with introductions and a pre-flight check. We'll enjoy the hospitality of the Club, delicious morning and afternoon teas, plus a nourishing lunch. On Saturday you are invited to join Moore Arts in an optional evening meal to socialize and share photographic experiences.
